



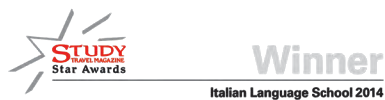
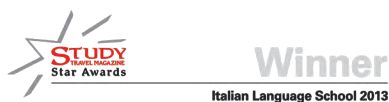

# Courses

## COMMUNICATIVE APPROACH

Our teaching method places great emphasis on the students' expectations, needs, and personal learning styles. We provide a unique learning environment that genuinely helps the students to achieve their personal goals in studying the Italian language and culture. A general communicative approach is combined with the newest learning techniques and teaching strategies, which allows the teacher to customise the learning path and program it for each individual learner.

Our Italian teachers work with learners with diverse needs. By listening to the students' requests and guiding them through every aspect and stage of the learning process, our highly qualified professionals do their best, and more, to offer all the students a chance to learn and improve in every single lesson. Our Italian courses are extremely dynamic and demand active participation from the students. At the same time taking into account each student's learning pace and character, the school provides a relaxing, productive, and authentically engaging communicative environment.

### Intensive STANDARD course:

Monday to Friday: from 9:15 am to 12:30 pm; 4 (45 minute) lessons a day, 20 lessons a week.

This is by far the most requested course. It combines multiple hours of instruction in a relaxing and friendly atmosphere. You can enrol for just a week or for months at a time. Four 45-minute lessons a day ensure constant and regular contact with the Italian language, and help develop a strong relationship between teachers and students. Students learn how to use the language in real-life situations, which can be easily applied to day-to-day activities while studying Italian in Rome.

Important: the students taking this course are eligible for a Study Visa. The School will provide an invitation letter, should the stay be of, at least, six months.

### Intensive Plus course:

Monday to Friday: from 9:15 am to 12:30 pm, from 1:30 pm to 3:00 pm; 6 (45 minutes) lessons a day, 30 lessons a week

The Intensive-Plus Course is a full-immersion program. It is specifically recommended for students who need to learn Italian quickly and whose stay in Rome is quite short.

Important: the students taking this course are eligible for a Study Visa. The School will provide an invitation letter but the stay should last at least six months.

### One to One:

Timetable is at the student's discretion

Individual Courses are ideal for students who want to learn Italian in a completely stress-free and informal atmosphere. Outdoor lessons are also a recommended option, as they provide the learner with a unique opportunity to savour the ancient city of Rome while acquiring functional and constructive language. Part of these lessons is the simple, but in no way less important, day-to-day learning how to cope in situations such as buying groceries or having a cup of cappuccino.

## Language Course

Italian Intensive Standard Course:

## Specialised Courses

### Business Italian

Communicating efficiently and clearly is a fundamental aspect of doing business in the global market. By using real-life scenarios, we have created a course that will offer insight into commonly used vocabulary, phrases, and expressions that have practical applications. You will examine Italian grammar analysing specifically the best ways to apply it in order to communicate your ideas. We will look at a number of topics, such as how to write a business letter or email, how to talk about work duties, and how to present and describe products and services. This course will boost your confidence to express yourself professionally in a variety of situations.

### Italian History Through the Cinema

This course will focus on the screening and analysis of Italian films, from the fall of fascism to the present day. We will watch some of the most iconic Italian films ( "La dolce vita", "La vita è bella"), while also exploring other genres (horror, spaghetti westerns) that made Italian cinema successful. We will outline and analyse the styles, the schools, and the directors of the last seven decades of the Italian cinema.

### Survey of Italian Literature

The aim of this course is to strengthen the students' knowledge of written and spoken Italian through the analysis and discussion of a variety of contemporary texts while incorporating audio-visual material. The material affords students a look at a variety of linguistic styles used in Italian Literature, provides an insight into contemporary Italian culture and society, and offers opportunities for discussion in Italian on relevant issues.

### History of Italian Renaissance

This course introduces students to the Italian Renaissance, a turning point that marked the departure from the Middle Age and laid the foundations for modern Western values and society. The course provides an overview of a wide variety of topics explored during this period of rapid change, ranging from arts and architecture, to science and politics, to society and government, as well as the scientific progress during this period. On top of these aspects, the students will come to understand the importance of the key cultural achievements and personalities of that period.

## History of Italian Fashion Design

This course introduces students to the history of the Italian fashion design. From textiles to design and accessories, haute-couture to prêt-à-porter (ready to wear), students will explore the many facets of the Italian Fashion industry. A look back at the history of the industry will examine the landmark moments of the industry, such as the High Fashion of the 50's, the birth of the fashion industry in Florence, and the ready-to-wear movement that sprung up in Milan. In order to foster a better understanding of the concept of Made in Italy, the course will highlight, through videos and excursions, the lives and careers of the most influential Italian designers of the 20th century.

## History of Opera

The course aims to familiarise the students with the main problems related to the operatic "language" and its development through the centuries. We will examine the biographical and stylistic profiles of influential composers and their impact on Opera and music in general; this includes such notable names as Monteverdi, Mozart, Rossini, Donizetti, Verdi, Puccini, Leoncavallo. We will analyse their work to determine and identify any individual characteristics of their work through their musical education, the relationship with the contemporary cultural and political worlds, as well as the stylistic development.

## The Ancient Rome Experience

The course presents students with an overview of the history of Ancient Rome, covering more than 2,500 years of civilization, and providing a unique opportunity to visit the city's most important archaeological sites. The historical review begins with the Etruscans and concludes with the collapse of the Western Roman Empire and the continuation of the Eastern Empire/Byzantine Empire. We shall explore the city by examining evidence and piecing together the puzzle that is Roman History. Students will be required to conduct research and take pictures to create a photographic presentation at the end of the course.

## History of Italian Cuisine

This course explores Italy's relationship with food over several centuries. The analysis of changes in the Italian culinary products, the eating habits of different socio-economic classes, and the role played by food in the formation of national and regional identities shall be carefully studied. Emphasis is put on the last two centuries, looking at the industrialization and technological progress that have helped to transform the Italian food culture.

## Introduction Tour

The school is located in one of Rome's most important neighbourhoods. Come with us and explore the beauty and history of the Prati district that encompasses the Vatican State and the beautiful Square of St. Peter's. Crossing via della Conciliazione you will find the secret passageway that the Pope would use to escape from St. Peter's to Castel Sant'Angelo in times of war and conflict.

## La Dolce Vita Tour

Rome is a unique city with a large and varied historic center. We begin the tour between the lions and obelisks of Piazza del Popolo then stroll down the great Roman shopping street, Via del Corso. At each intersection, nestled between boutique shops and designer fashion shops, you will have the opportunity to gaze at the beauty of the Trevi Fountain and the Spanish Steps. What are you waiting for? Grab some comfortable shoes, a bottle of water and you are ready to go!

## Circus Maximus & The Aventine

We start at the ruins of the ancient Circus Maximus, once the home of Rome's chariot racing circuit. We then move on to the Aventine district. From the Aventine, we can gaze at one of the most picturesque buildings in Rome: The Pyramid built by Caius Cestius as his mausoleum. After, we visit some of the most important and marvellous medieval churches Rome has to offer: Santa Sabina, Santa Prisca, Santi Bonifacio e Alessio and San Saba.

## Piazza Navona Tour

As we cross the Tiber we reach Piazza Navona where we stumble upon the beauty of the world famous Fountain of the Four Rivers, located a stone's throw from one of the symbols of Roman classicism: The Pantheon. As we cross Via Vittorio Emanuele, hidden by the Roman skyline, we find Piazza Campo De Fiori. In Rome, there is a marked difference between the daytime and nightlife. During the day, the square is a local market where you can find all the essentials for an authentic, healthy Mediterranean diet. While in the evening, the square is transformed, revealing the youthful face of the city. Tourists and locals alike sit chatting together, relaxing under the watchful eye of Giordano Bruno, at the center of the square.

## Italian on the Go!

### Piazza Venezia, Altare della Patria and Campidoglio

This tour will introduce you to the best places in Rome, starting from Piazza del Campidoglio, designed by Michelangelo Bonarroti. The Equestrian Statue of Marco Aurelio dominates the whole square. At the foot of the Capitoline Hill, we will stop in Piazza Venezia, in order to admire the huge Altare della Patria, a national monument built in honor of Victor Emmanuel (the first King of a unified Italy). Our tour will end with a wander around Via dei Condotti, one of the best shopping streets for Haute couture in Rome.

### Trastevere and Jewish Ghetto

Trastevere's neighborhood is located on the West bank of the Tiber. Small shops, churches, and independent art galleries all await for you to be visited. We will escape Rome's tourist circuits to explore hidden parts of the historic center.

After our visit to the neighbourhood, we will cross the river and discover that...Rome has an island! Our tour will end with a leisurely stroll through the Jewish Ghetto, an area which combines Jewish culture and Roman architecture.
