STUDIOITALIA in Rome is only five minutes from St. Peter's Square. Very close to the School is the Ottaviano metro station, and the entire area is very well-connected to public transport.

STUDIOITALIA in Milan is only five minutes from Piazza del Duomo and ten minutes from the city's most renowned shopping streets. The Piazzale Loreto metro station is very close to the School, and the area is nicely connected to various means of public transport.

COMMUNICATIVE APPROACH

Our teaching method places great emphasis on the students' expectations, needs and personal learning styles. Intensive STANDARD course:

Monday to Friday: from 09:30 am to 13:00 pm; 4 lessons a day ,20 lessons a week.

This is by far the most requested course. It combines multiple hours with a relaxing and friendly atmosphere. You can enrol for just a week or for months at a time. Mere four lesson hours a day ensure constant and regular contact with the Italian language, and help develop a strong relationship between teachers and students. Students learn how to use the language in real-life situations, which can be easily applied to day-to-day activities while studying Italian in Rome.

Important: the students taking this course are eligible for a Study Visa. The School will provide an invitation letter, should the stay be of, at least, six months.

Intensive Plus course:

Monday to Friday: from 09:30 am to 13:00 pm, from 13:30 pm to 15:00 pm; 6 lessons a day, 30 lessons a week

The Intensive-Plus Course is a full-immersion route. It is specifically recommended for students who need to learn Italian quickly and whose stay in Rome is quite brief.

Important: the students taking this course are eligible for a Study Visa. The School will provide an invitation letter, should the stay be of, at least, six months.

One to One:

Individual Courses are ideal for students who want to learn Italian in a completely stress-proof and informal atmosphere. Specialised Courses

Italian for Business

Communicating efficiently and clearly is a fundamental aspect of doing business in the global marketplace. By utilising real-life scenarios we have created a course that will offer you an insight into commonly used vocabulary, phrases and expressions that have practical applications. You will examine Italian grammar analysing specifically the best ways to apply it in order to communicate your ideas. We will look at a number of topics, for example how to write a business letter or email, how to talk about duties and work, presenting and describing products and services. This course will boost your confidence to express yourself professionally in a variety of situations.



Italian History Through the Cinema



This course will focus on the screening and analysis of Italian films, with a focus on the end of fascism to the present day. We will watch some of the most iconic Italian films ("La dolce vita", "La vita è bella"), while also exploring other genres (horror, spaghetti westerns) that made Italian cinema successful. We will outline and analyse the styles, the schools and the directors of the last seven decades of the Italian cinema.

Survey of Italian Literature

The aim of this course is to strengthen the students' knowledge of written and spoken Italian through analysis and discussion of a variety of contemporary authentic texts, incorporating audio-visual material. The material affords students a look at a variety of linguistic styles used in Italian Literature, provides an insight into contemporary Italian culture and society, and offers opportunities for discussion in Italian on relevant issues.



History of Italian Renaissance



This course introduces students to the Italian Renaissance, a turning point that marked the departure from the Medieval Age, and laid the foundations for modern Western values and society. The course provides an overview of a wide variety of topics explored during this period of rapid change, ranging from arts and architecture, to science and politics, society and government, as well as the scientific advancement during this period. On top of these aspects, the students will come to understand the importance of the key cultural achievements and personalities of that period.

History of Italian Fashion Design

Using Italian Fashion as a model, this course makes students familiar with the history of the Italian fashion design. From textiles, to design and accessories, haute-couture and prêt-a-porter (ready to wear), students will explore the many facets of the Italian Fashion industry. A look back at the history of the industry will encompass the period of time pre-1939 and will examine the landmark moments of the industry, the High Fashion of the 50's, the birth of the fashion industry in Florence and the ready-to-wear movement sprung up in Milan. In order to foster a better understanding of the concept of Made in Italy, the course will highlight, through videos and excursions, the lives and careers of the most influential Italian designers of the 20th century.



History of Opera



The course aims to familiarise the students with the main problems related to the operatic "language" and its development through the centuries. We will examine the biographical and stylistic profiles of influential composers and their impact on Opera and music in general; this includes such notable names as Monteverdi, Mozart, Rossini, Donizetti, Verdi, Puccini, Leoncavallo. We will analyse their work to determine and identify any individual characteristics of their work through their musical education, the relationship with the contemporary cultural and political worlds, as well as the stylistic development.

Ancient Rome Experienced

The course presents students with an overview of the history of Ancient Rome, covering more than 2,500 years of civilisation, and providing with a unique opportunity to visit the city's most important archaeological sites. The historical review begins with the Etruscans and concludes with the collapse of the Western Roman Empire and the continuation of the Eastern Empire/Byzantine Empire. We shall explore the city by examining evidence and piecing together the puzzle that is Roman History. Students will be required to conduct research and take pictures to create a photographic presentation for the end of the course.



History of Italian Cuisine



The course explores Italy's relationship with food over centuries. The analysis of changes in the Italian culinary products, the eating habits of different socio-economic classes, and the role played by food in the formation of national and regional identities shall be carefully employed. Emphasis is put on the last two centuries, looking at the industrialisation and technological progress that have helped to transform the Italian food culture.

Plug-into Tour

The school is located in one of Rome's most important neighbourhoods. Come with us and explore the beauty and history of the Prati district that encompasses the Vatican State and the beautiful Square of St. Peter's. Crossing via della Conciliazione you arrive at the secret passageway that the Pope would use to escape from St. Peters to Castel Sant'Angelo in times of war and conflict.

La Dolce Vita Tour

Rome is a unique city with a large and varied historic center. We begin the tour between the lions and obelisks of Piazza del Popolo then strolling down the great Roman shopping street, Via del Corso. At each intersection, nestled between boutique shops and designer fashion shops, you will have the opportunity to gaze at the beauty of the Trevi Fountain and the Spanish Steps. What are you waiting? Comfortable shoes, a bottle of water and we are ready to go!









Circus Maximus & The Aventine

Starting from the ruins of the ancient Circus Maximus, once the home of Rome's chariot racing circuit, we arrive at the Aventine district. From the Aventine we can gaze at one of the most picturesque buildings in Rome: The Pyramid built by Caius Cestius as his mausoleum as well as visit some of the most important and marvellous medieval churches Rome has to offer, Santa Sabina, Santa Prisca, Santi Bonifacio e Alessio and San Saba.

Piazza Navona Tour

As we cross the Tiber we reach Piazza Navona where we stumble upon the beauty of the Fountain of the Four Rivers, famous worldwide, located a stones throw from one of the symbols of Roman classicism, The Pantheon. As we cross Via Vittorio Emanuele, hidden by the Roman skyline, we find Piazza Campo Dei Fiori. In Rome, there is a marked difference between the daytime and nightlife. During the day, the square is a local market where you can find all the essentials for an authentic, healthy Mediterranean diet. While in the evening, the square is transformed, revealing the youthful face of the city. Tourists and locals alike sit chatting together, relaxing under the watchful eye of Giordano Bruno, at the center of the square.

(VERDI) TOUR



Verdi Tour

Born in a small town in Emilia, Maestro Verdi went to spend his life in Milan. The city represents the cradle of the young Verdi's first artistic breakthrough, with his "Nabucco" in the front line at the Teatro alla Scala. This was the very moment when his symbiotic relationship with the city was born and began to develop, eventually giving birth to his career as an artist. We shall visit the places where Giuseppe Verdi used to live and linger: his first home in Milan, as well as one of his greatest friends' Alessandro Manzoni's dwelling. Our tour will continue with il Caffè Cova and il Casinò dei Nobili, until reaching the very last place where Verdi used to live, Hotel et de Milan.

Da Vinci Tour

Together we shall revisit Leonardo Da Vinci's Milanese experience, starting from his arrival in Italy's biggest city of the time. The tour will focus upon the artist's unfinished projects, of which the Equestrian Monument commissioned by Francesco Sforza is a great example, as well as on his other and numerous works of art, conceived and designed in Milan and now scattered all over the world. La Dama con l'Ermellino and l'Uomo Vitruviano, accompanied by his Last Supper, are only a few of his masterpieces introduced through the tour. Finally, you are given the opportunity to explore la Chiesa di Santa Maria delle Grazie and witness genuine work of an unparalleled genius in the first person.
